

14:15 | **Epistemology workshop**: The challenges of researching feminist and LGBTQIA+ movements in the context of rising conservative and anti-gender politics and the ways to overcome them.

The rise of political initiatives against gender equality and the intensification of anti-gender politics revived questions of scientific knowledge production, about objectivity and value-freedom of research, related to the fairness and responsibilities of the researchers and their philosophies of research. Following Harding (2015) one should reflect about how will a piece of research affect the lives of the people who are the subjects of that research? While the question concerns both research on anti-gender movements and on progressive movements, the focus of this session will be on feminist, LGBTQIA+, sexual and reproductive rights movements who oppose and resist anti-gender politics. What are the challenges of doing research about progressive movements in times of democratic backsliding? How to do research that benefits democratic and social justice ends? What are the risks of misuse and instrumentalization of research about progressive movements to serve conservative goals? Should and is the voice of progressive activists heard about whether and how the research will be done?

\*During this session some activists from the LGBTQIA+ and feminist movement organizations and groups will join us for collective reflection, knowledge exchange and knowledge production related to questions of epistemology. One option would be to write an epilogue for the book out of this collective reflection or we can choose another format that we might deem appropriate.

The session is accompanied by a workshop on verbal defense against anti-gender by Irene Zeilinger, founder of the feminist self-defense organization in Brussels, Garance. She is also pursuing a PhD on the role of violence in masculine identities at Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB).




